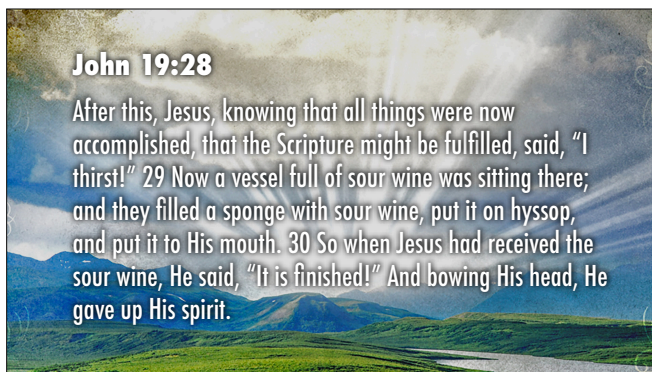




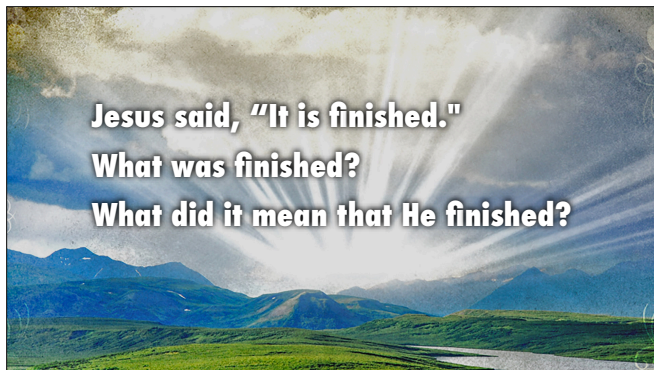

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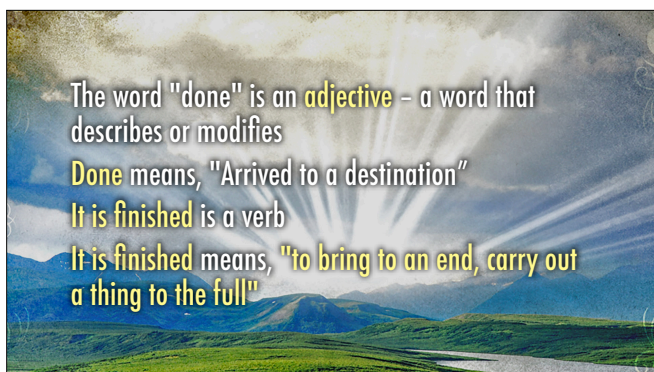


The word "done" is an adjective. An adjective is a word that describes or modifies. Words like huge, red, angry, tremendous, unique, rare, or adjectives.

It is finished means, "to bring to an end, carry out a thing to the full"

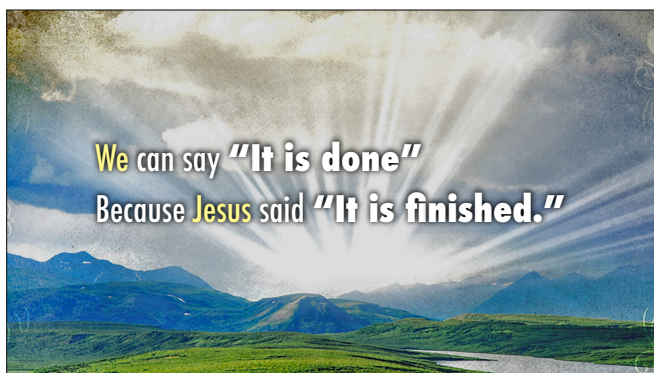


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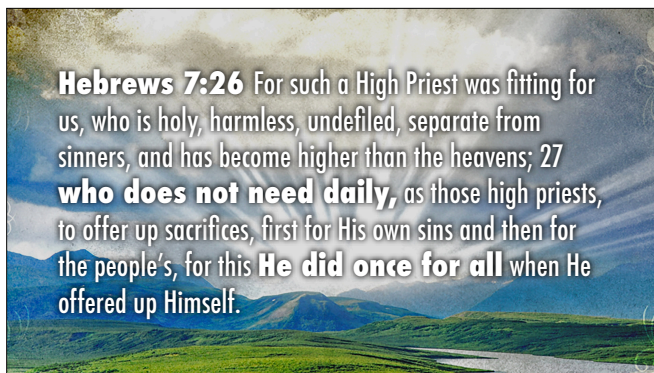
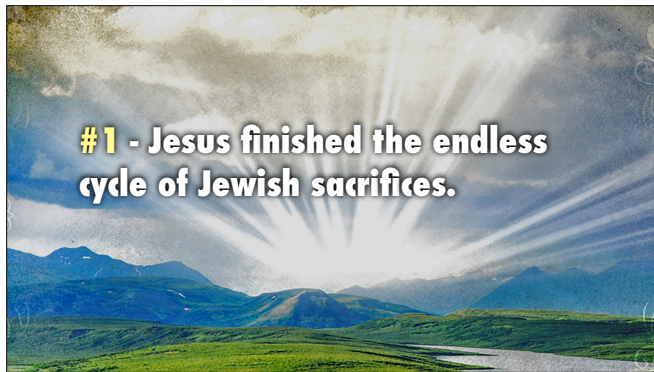

I realized that the title to the message today "it is done" is something we can say because Jesus said it is finished.

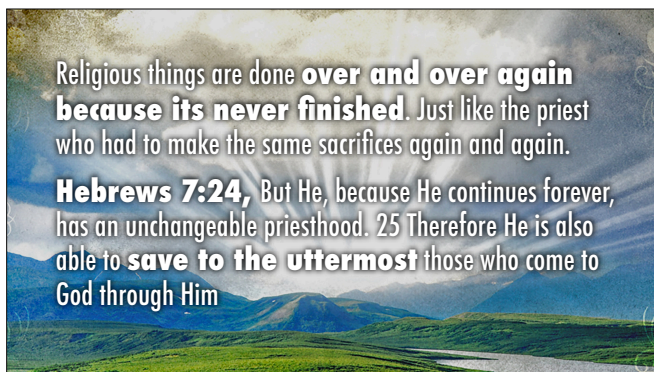
One of the features of religion is getting people into a cycle of doing the same thing over and over again, not from a place of decision and worship, but as a act to please God and earn His favor and help.





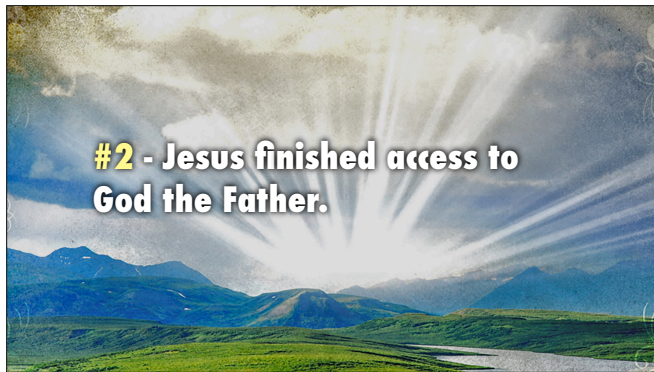

Saved means wholeness, spirit soul body

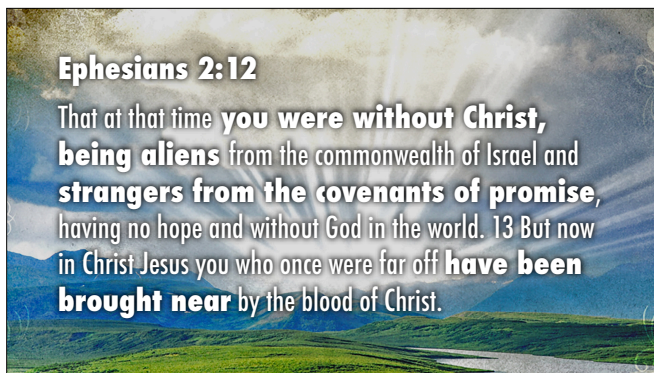


The things that we do occur over and over again because we never finish. Just like the priest to vote who had to make the same sacrifices again and again.

## #2 - Jesus finished access to God the Father.

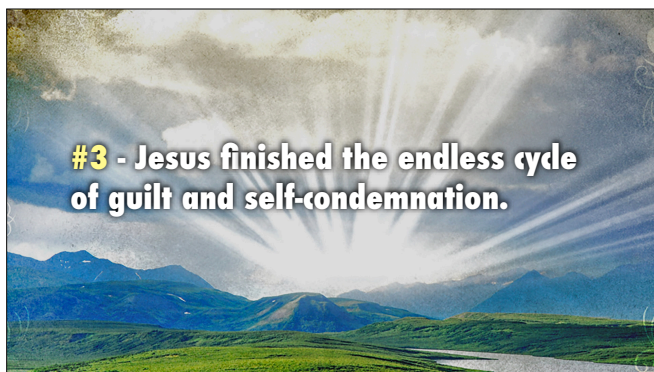


### Ephesians 2:12



The second son was hasty and disingenuous meaning, “Not sincere, typically by pretending that one knows less about something than one really does. “




## #3 - Jesus finished the endless cycle of guilt and self-condemnation.

We preach His **resurrection**.

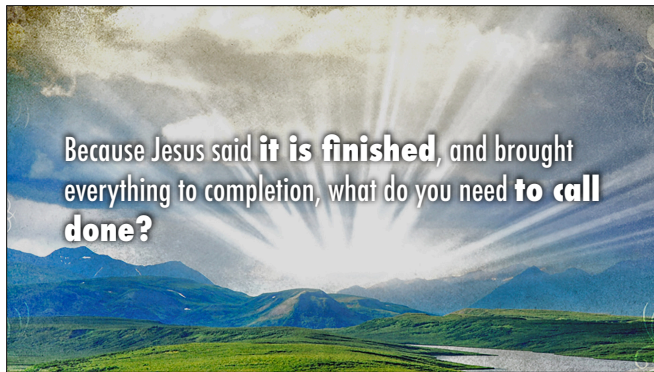


### 1 Corinthians 15:12-14
