That's part of the basis for this series, navigate how to successfully journey through life and these times.

Today we're going to get into something that's very much a part of our times, and that is the impact of social media and something called algorithms. Let me say, this is not going to be deep, but it won't be a typical Sermon. You know that we don't do typical sermons.

Going to provide insight and understanding into it people are dealing with every day. So don't be startled at some of the terms I'm going to use, because I'm going to explain it. Only thing I need you to do is pay attention and I guarantee you God will give you understanding.

We're going to take a look at systems that lead to failure and success. Romans 12 verse two says "And do not be conformed to this world but be transformed by the renewing of your mind."






Navigating systems of God and men is essential for living a productive life. We are all parts of things larger than ourselves. The whole concept of navigating is based on dealing with forces and factors that we cannot control.

What you cannot control, you must navigate. For example, this is the whole point to learning how to drive. An experienced driver has the illusion of controlling the power of a car and traffic. In reality, drivers have learned to navigate how a car works and what to do in traffic as well as within various conditions.

You can see it when training a young person to drive. I remember taking one my children out driving after it snowed. We went to an empty parking lot. The instruction was to drive straight at about 25 miles per hour, and the turn right like normal. The car started to turn but then spun around, and the driver did not know how to control it. Everyone has to learn how to navigate driving on snow. Modern cars can correct for a lot of mistakes. Today we have something called antilock brakes that pulse the brakes on and off quickly when you press the brakes. You don't want the wheels to lock up and start sliding. Back in the day, you were the anti-lock brakes! You were taught to tap and release the brakes quickly until you slowed down in a controlled manner.



Catholicism is an example of a whole system of religion. They have their own country, called the Vatican. Protestantism (meaning to protest) is a counter to the catholic system. Something started by the 15th Century preacher Martin Luther who challenges Roman Catholic Church corrupt system of selling "indulgences" to absolve sin. Theologians like Augustine (340–430) had emphasized the primacy of the Bible rather than Church officials as the ultimate religious authority. Luther wrote the "Disputation on the Power and Efficacy of Indulgences," also known as "The 95 Theses. Popular legend has it that on October 31, 1517 Luther defiantly nailed a copy of his 95 Theses to the door of the Wittenberg Castle church. Luther's act of

rebellion led to the Protestant Reformation.



There are systems in play in ways that we're not aware of. I was involved in a group of urban and suburban pastors. I thought we were operating on equal terms. We had a meeting they concluded with prayer and smiles. I drove away I remembered that I forgot something. When I returned to the meeting place, the white pastors were having another meeting without us. Then I realized, we were only part of a system of which we were really not a part.

We know that there is a system governing finance, economics, and investments.

We know that there are systems at institutions such as colleges. When students form government and have meetings, make decisions, protest for college, and such. They operate inside of a larger system that guarantees that they will never have real authority. Student government is a system they give students the impression that they're in charge of something. It's also an exercise in understanding the real world.




Psalm 103:19, The Lord has established His throne in heaven, And His kingdom rules over all

This does not suggest that God control every outcome. He put the frameworks in place that we have to manage. If you go up on the roof of this building and jump off, the system of God's natural science and gravity will injure or kill you.

Systemic problems occur when systems are developed by people to control people, while keeping fundamentals of the system hidden from "rank and file" type people.

Everything of significance is connected to a system, including God's church and His Kingdom.

What is a system, in the big picture? (We know about systems on a small scale like the system that makes your car or computer work)



The Bible does not use the word system in the way we are talking about it today. However, God has ordered creation according to a system. We can call it the Kingdom of God.

This is especially true for Google and YouTube. On Facebook, if you limit your "friends" to people you actually know, you'll have much less unwanted content. You also don't want to follow "friends" who have crazy friends.



What is a Social Media Algorithm?


Social media algorithms are a way of sorting posts in a users' feed based on user preferences.

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The kingdom of God is indeed a system, even though the Bible doesn't use that term. But it fits our definition of a system, "A system affects the whole not only the parts, which is why we call its effect 'systemic.'"

When I ask Alexa, "What is the weather forecast," after getting the answer, it sometimes tries to day, "By the way, you can automatically order copy paper every month." I always say, "Alexa, stop." That trains the algorithm not to suggest things to me. If you engage it, the algorithm will conclude you want more of the same.



The best you can do is start you day in God's word and let the Holy Spirit guide you and become your algorithm
