

In this series we have been learning about many dimensions to navigating life. I appreciate that my wife add it to our understanding last week with a tremendous message on the conquerors mindset.


One of my assignments in ministry is to present the word of God in a way that you can use it for your every day life. That's part of the basis for this series, navigate how to successfully journey through life and these times.

Better, Bigger, Braver, and Bolder

It is not that you can't get things done by yourself. It is that you can do better, in terms of quality and quality with others. 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Those of us who drove cars in the 1970's know about bigger cars! Folks today have no idea! We drove, or wished we were driving, big cars — also called "Land Yachts." There were cars so long that you could get lost in the trunk. I rented a Town Car on a trip to California in the early 1990's. I brought my golf clubs. When some golf balls fell out of my bag, I had to climb all the way in the trunk to get them from the corner.

People often look for things that are big and shiny, rather than recognizing quality, which may come in a small package.

The mistake a lot of people make feeling intimated by people like that, trying to cut them down to their own size, or letting envy and jealously ruin an opportunity to grow.

The worse thing you can do is not pay attention and not follow instructions.

That why is good to read biographies and study history. It is amazing what you can learn "vicariously," meaning through the "flesh/experiences" of others.



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
